Big Change for Medicaid Reimbursement of Prenatal Care WILL YOUR OFFICE BE READY?

On May 8, 2020, New Jersey will enforce new data reporting requirements as condition of Medicaid payment for prenatal care. Under new law, prenatal providers must submit a Perinatal Risk Assessment Plus (PRA Plus) for all uninsured and government-sponsored insurance (i.e. Charity Care, Medicaid, Medicaid Managed Care, Medicare, etc.) patients. Providers who fail to submit data for these patients in the PRA Plus System cannot be paid for prenatal services.

Free Assistance to Implement PRA Plus

To help providers implement the PRA data system, the state has contracted with Family Health Initiatives (FHI) for technical assistance. FHI services are offered at NO COST to providers and the agency's assistance includes all aspects of system implementation, navigation and management.
